Our presentations have the most impact on those attending in a 1½ hour time frame. However, it is adjustable with less material covered depending on the venue. We are currently assembling teams for our presentation. The presenters and stories may vary.

INTRODUCTION

1. 'One in three of us are impacted by drunk driving'. The name was taken from the statistic, because we are 1N3 who has been impacted.
 - a. Ask for volunteers for the Fatal Vision Goggle sobriety test
 - b. Volunteers are asked to walk a line wearing the goggles
 - c. Open with the "1N3 Introduction Video"

PERSONAL IMPACT

2. "I am 1N3 who has been forever impacted." Stories are shared of personal impact and how people became 1N3.
 - a. Individuals volunteer to share their personal story of how intoxicated driving has changed their life. They might be the victim or the offender.
 - b. Show personal story videos if available either before, during or after the story

CHOICES MATTER

3. An individual's choices are important and affect more than just you. Your choices affect; family, friends, schoolmates, co-workers, and even complete strangers whether positively or negatively.

FACTS, STATISTICS, SENERIOS

4. Driving intoxicated is NOT worth it
 - a. Discuss the fines such as, court cost, jail, bail, and driver's licenses reinstatement for DUI/DWI
 - b. Various possible sentencing such as, time in jail/prison, DUI School, Ignition Interlock Program, probation, public works days
 - c. Other expenses of a DUI/DWI, i.e., SR-22 insurance, loss of work due to incarceration and court hearings, towing and vehicle storage fees
 - d. BAC levels and the amount of time needed to reduce the alcohol in a person's system
 - e. Area statistics

DISTRACTED DRIVING

5. Texting, eating, applying makeup, too much activity by other passengers, etc.
 - a. Discuss statistics and scenarios and show photos taken at crash scenes where individuals had been driving distracted and not watching the road.

Q & A

6. The attendees are giving the opportunity to ask questions and share comments. (*This is offered ONLY in smaller groups. Students in an all school assemblies will have time during their lunch period to speak to the 1N3 staff to ask questions and share one on one.*)

INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY

7. Everyone is presented with the opportunity to make the commitment to do their part in helping to keep our roads safe.
 - a. The “Safe Driving Pledge” covers
 - Not getting behind the wheel intoxicated
 - Not letting others get behind the wheel intoxicated
 - Not riding with someone driving intoxicated
 - Not driving distracted by texting, eating, putting on makeup, or just too much activity by passengers
 - Not driving while too sleepy to drive
 - Wearing a seatbelt

GIVING THE GIFT OF LIFE

8. Briefly discuss the importance and choice of organ donation. (Share story if presenter has a personal experience.)
 - a. One in three people are waiting for an organ transplant
 - b. Donor family and recipient impact
 - c. Share history for recording the song “Your Guardian Angel” and filming the music video.
 - d. Show “Your Guardian Angel” video

UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL
(IF WEATHER PERMITS)

9. With the actual mangled vehicle of a DUI victim as a visual it speaks very loudly without saying a word, and makes a lasting impression. ***(If this is an all school assembly, the students can view the vehicle during the lunch period if presentation time does not allow.)***
 - a. Those attending the presentation will be escorted outside where the vehicle is setup
 - b. The 1N3 Presenter will briefly share the detail and injuries of the victim
 - c. Those who wish to take a closer look may do so WITHOUT touching. (This is for safety reasons) Photos may be taken and 1N3 staff and volunteers are available for one on one questions and comments.

THIS CONCLUDES OUR PRESENTATION

(All school assemblies are divided. The presentation time frame is 50 minutes to one hour, and the vehicle is viewed during the lunch period. There will also be a table with 1N3 information, t-shirts and wristbands for donations. The student will have the opportunity to sign the "Safe Driving Pledge" at this time as well. 1N3 staff and/or volunteers in the lunchroom area will man this table.)

We will arrive approximately thirty (30) minutes to one (1) hour prior to the presentation. This time will be confirmed by email ahead of time from, events@iam1n3.org, after discussing the details on the time frame and setup options.

We feel strongly that a price tag cannot be put on human life, for this reason we do not charge a fee for our presentation. However, there are many expenses, which must be covered. We are not federally or grant funded, and function solely on DONATION from individual, organizations and business who see the value in our presentation. 1N3 is recognized as a 501c3.
